


UVC wavelengths are capable of inactivating bacteria, viruses and protozoa, making this an effective, environmentally friendly and chemical-free way to prevent microorganisms from replicating in hospitals.

During 2019, more than 1,135 cardiac catheterization procedures were performed at the James Family Heart Center.

COVID-19 IN WEST YAVAPAI COUNTY

Thanks to the support from our donor community, we were prepared and able to mobilize and deploy the resources necessary to meet this unprecedented challenge.

COVID-19 Community Response

This spring, as the COVID-19 pandemic became a very real threat to our community, your YRMC family worked diligently to respond to the crisis.

Nurses, physicians, engineering staff, environmental services team members and more adapted quickly to the radically changing healthcare landscape. Their teamwork, intelligent decision making, and resourcefulness allowed YRMC to care for those affected and keep our patients and staff safe.

On the Front Lines – YRMC's COVID-19 Community Testing Team

YRMC's COVID-19 testing team was one of only two local facilities to provide drive-through coronavirus testing free of charge to community members. Testing was conducted at the Prescott Valley campus for several weekends in May. Our team of 35 healthcare professionals included Admitting, Community Outreach, Information Technology, Laboratory, Nursing and Medical Staff personnel.

COVID-19 Triage Tents

To ensure the safety of our patients and staff, people exhibiting symptoms or reporting potential exposure to the COVID-19 virus are triaged to these ultra-high-tech mobile units. These units allow our healthcare team to provide additional screening to patients before admission to our hospitals.



Protecting Our Young and Vulnerable

YRMC's Partners for Healthy Students (PHS) program provides exceptional primary and behavioral healthcare services at no-cost to children and their families throughout the school year. This year, however, the PHS team continued caring for families even after schools had closed. Their goal? To ensure families who lost health coverage due to the pandemic had access to high quality healthcare services.

Expanded Isolation Bed Capacity

To ensure the health and safety of patients and staff, YRMC expanded the number of isolation beds necessary to accommodate COVID-19 patients. Today, Yavapai Regional Medical Center's West and East campuses have the capacity to quickly transition nursing units to meet fluctuating demand.

COVID-19 Screeners

With certain services limited due to the pandemic, YRMC employees from a broad range of departments were immediately redeployed to serve as COVID-19 screeners. All patients and staff entering YRMC facilities must have their temperature checked, are questioned as to their health status and any potential exposure to the virus, and are issued a protective mask.

3 Key Aspects of CARES Act for Individual Taxpayers

DEDUCTION AVAILABLE: A charitable deduction of up to \$300 per taxpayer (\$600 for a married couple) is available to those who take the standard deduction (taxpayers who do not itemize their deductions). This new deduction is an "above the line" adjustment to income that will reduce a taxpayer's adjusted gross income (AGI) and reduce their taxable income.

To qualify, you would have to give a donation to a qualified charity like YRMC. If you have already made a donation since January 1, that contribution counts toward the \$300 cap. A donation to a donor-advised fund (DAF) does not qualify for this new deduction.

NEW CHARITABLE DEDUCTION LIMITS: The CARES Act allows individuals who itemize deductions to deduct much greater amounts of their contributions. Taxpayers can elect to deduct donations up to 100% of their 2020 AGI (up from 60% previously). The new deduction is only for cash gifts that go to a public charity, like the YRMC Foundation.

The old deduction rules apply for donations to a donor-advised fund (DAF) or private foundation. The new limits also do not apply to gifts of appreciated stock.

If your donations are substantial enough that you give more than your income this year, you won't lose the deduction for the excess amount. You can use it next year, as has always been the case.

Corporations can also deduct higher amounts for cash gifts to public charities. They may deduct up to 25% of taxable income, up from the previous limit of 10%.

CARES ACT

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act became law on March 27, 2020; a \$2 trillion economic stimulus package to provide immediate relief for taxpayers and nonprofits.

By including expanded charitable giving incentives, Congress is acknowledging and endorsing the critical work of nonprofits like Yavapai Regional Medical Center (YRMC) as essential services. It is the first time Congress has passed this type of giving incentive in response to a disaster or national emergency.

Kimball Arnold Seymour Dicker Ron Harvey, MD[†] Joe Jackson[†] Kevin Keighron Linda Medina, RN Rowle Simmons Roger Stewart[†] **NEW** Required Minimum Distributions Waived in 2020 for Most: Required minimum distributions (RMD) for individuals over age 72 are suspended until 2021. This includes distributions that are typically required from traditional IRAs, defined benefit pension plans and 457 plans.

Account owners over age $70\frac{1}{2}$ can make a significant charitable gift by giving directly from an IRA to a charity through a qualified charitable distribution (QCD) and avoid taxable income. Making a QCD will allow itemizers and nonitemizers alike to direct up to \$100,000 from their IRA to charities in a tax efficient manner.

Giving USA: The Annual Report on Philanthropy is published each year

as a public service initiative through the partnership of the Giving USA Foundation[™], The Giving Institute and the Indiana University Lilly Family School of Philanthropy. This report includes the most comprehensive and rigorously researched information available on charitable giving in the United States.

In 2019, Americans gave \$449.64 billion to charity. Where did the generosity come from?

- Giving by Individuals 69%
- Giving by Foundations 17%
- Giving by Bequest 10%
 - Giving by Corporations 5%

Giving by individuals has increased in four of the last five years.

9% of dollars were directed to healthoriented charities.

In 2018, YRMC embarked on an ambitious capital improvement program designed to:

- Expand healthcare services;
- Invest in the latest technology; and
- Improve patient access, convenience, and comfort.

Today, even amid the challenges of the current healthcare environment, we're moving forward at a rapid pace. In fact, an average of 40 design and construction projects are underway at any given time in the YRMC healthcare network. The pictorial at right shows several of these major projects. It also illustrates the scope and scale of YRMC's investment in our community.

Cardiac Catheterization Lab Construction

To meet growing community need, YRMC opened its new Cardiac Catheterization Lab in November 2019. This third lab incorporates technology so advanced it is the first of its kind in the western United States. Immediately after completing Cath Lab 3, renovation began on Cath Lab 1 (see page 4).

New Cardiovascular Intensive Care Unit

YRMC opened its new high-tech, 12-bed Cardiovascular Intensive Care Unit at the James Family Heart Center in early May.

Laboratory Services Expansion and Reorientation

YRMC's investment in new laboratory analyzers will increase the speed and volume of testing in its Laboratories. To accommodate the analyzers, the Clinical Laboratory, Microbiology Department, and Pathology Department at both YRMC campuses were relocated and renovated.





Energy Center Expansion and Retooling

YRMC is ready for current and future energy demands thanks to a major investment in new chillers, generators, and cooling towers which comprise its Energy Center.

Outpatient Services Parking Structure

A new 450-space parking structure on the YRMC West campus is nearing completion. The structure will provide convenient and safe access to YRMC's Outpatient Services Building, which is currently under construction.

Outpatient Services Building

Construction of the three-story, 100,000-squarefoot Outpatient Services Building is well underway with completion scheduled for the end of 2021.

Wellness Center Relocation

The YRMC Wellness Center – home to the Harold James Family Center for Physical Rehabilitation Services and the Pendleton Center for Health and Fitness – relocated in February to its beautifully renovated location on Iron Springs Road (formerly New Frontiers).




