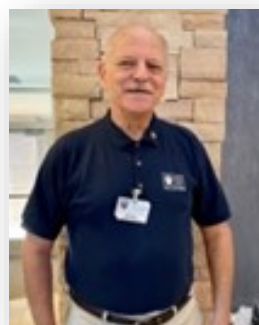
Holiday Duets

- ◆ I started as a volunteer before becoming an employee and since I enjoy it, I've continued both roles



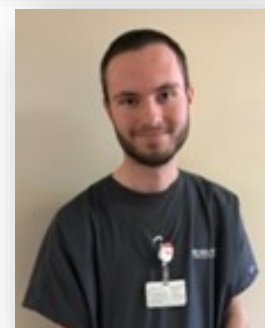

Wayne & Brona – the village is growing thanks to you!

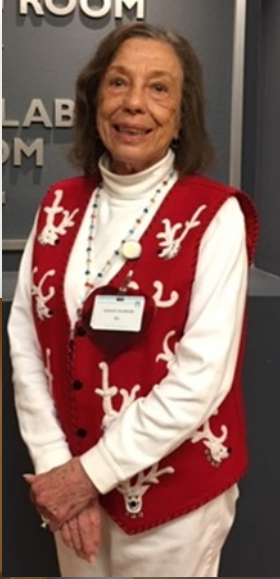
