Communicating With Our Patients

Video Sign Language Interpretation Carts...

When we have a patient that is Deaf or Hearing Impaired and can use sign language, we will be able to connect via the internet to a Sign Linguist It is basically a computer and a screen on a cart specially designed for connecting to the internet Sign Language Interpretation site and can be used in any of our hospital service areas. The patient will be able to communicate easily with our physicians and staff without waiting for a Sign Linguist to physically come in.

Language Communication... YRMC uses *CyraCom Interpretation Service* for language interpretation and translation. When assisting Limited English Proficiency patients use the *"blue phones"*. These phones will connect you and our patients with a Language interpreter. A phone should stay with the patient during the entire hospital stay. YRMC also has staff that may be available to assist our patients with language communication.

Heard of Hearing Amplified Phones...

YRMC has available two Amplified phones, one at each campus. These "white Amplified phones" (with big numbers on the receiver) can be used when a patient is hard of hearing as a replacement to the phones in the inpatient rooms.

At West Campus contact the operator to check out the Amplified phone. At East Campus contact the Nursing Supervisors to check out the phone.

Contact Information Systems Help Desk if there are any problems with any of these devices or phones.

Complaint Handling Process

All volunteers PLEASE follow these steps when you're confronted with a patient/family member/visitor who has a complaint. This is the approved process and should always be

1. Determine which depart ment the complaint concerns and contact them *FIRST*, regardless of whether the person is demanding to see the CEO, etc.

Use the Complaint Roster to determine whom to call. An

updated roster is provided to the Info Desk, and/or you may call the Volunteer Svcs office to ask. 2. If you are unable to reach the appropriate department Staff member, **THEN** call the Administrator On Call, using only the number provided on the Admin
